

- 4. Payment: A signature constitutes a legal contract to buy. All sales are final and there will be no exchanges or refunds unless specified. All items must be paid for by the end of the evening with the credit card provided during check-in.
- 5. Check-Out: If you purchased any items during the evening, proceed to check-out to pick up your items. Receipts will be emailed to the email address provided during check-in. All items must be removed the evening of the auction.
- 6. Shared Purchases: If you share a purchase with others, the winning bidder is responsible for the entire price. If a group is bidding on one item, please designate one person to place your bids.
